

CISF gears up to host national police judo

Hyderabad, July 20: The Central Industrial Security Force (CISF), under the aegis of the All India Police Sports Control Board (AIPSCB), will host the 11th All India Police Judo Cluster Championship at GMC Balayogi Indoor Stadium in Gachibowli from July 23 to 30.

More than 1,600 sportspersons representing 36 State Police and Central Armed Police Force (CAPF) organisations will participate in the eight-day championship. Athletes will compete in five combat disci-

plines — Judo, Wushu, Taekwondo, Karate and Pencak Silat.

Details of the championship were announced at a press conference addressed by National Industrial Security Academy, CISF, Director/IG Harpreet Kaur Sohi at the NISA here on Monday.

Addressing the media, Mrs Sohi said the championship reflects CISF's commitment to promoting sporting excellence among police and CAPF personnel and provides athletes in uniform an important platform to demonstrate their talent

and progress to higher levels of competition.

Olympic shuttler Parupalli Kashyap and rowing coach Ismail Baig highlighted the strong connection between sports and uniformed services, where discipline, resilience, teamwork and perseverance are essential attributes.

Established in 1965, AIPSCB comprises 53 Police and Central Police organisations and conducts 18 sports clusters covering 28 disciplines, with nearly 12,000 men and women sportspersons participating annually.
